Provision	Focus	Impact
1:1 tuition (Beat Dyslexia, reading support, STAR partners)	One-to-one tuition for Pupil Premium children who are not on track to achieve expected progress in the core subjects.	85% in maths, 85% in reading and 90% in writing of Pupil Premium children made at least good progress in 2014/15.
Teaching Assistant support	To provide extra interventions and support to Pupil Premium pupils not on track to make expected progress.	
Booster classes	Our specialist mathematics teacher to work alongside Year 6 and to teach smaller groups targeting children to make at least good progress.	82% in maths, 75% in reading and 75% writing in these smaller groups made at least good progress in 2014/15.
Reading Recovery teacher	Increase the % of children passing the phonics test and achieving in line with age expectations reading outcomes.	100% passed the Year 2 retake and 80% passed the Year 1 phonics test compared to 67% the previous year.
Numbers Count teacher	Deliver a highly specialised 1:1 and group maths intervention enabling accelerated progress and to encourage confidence and improved attitude.	68% receiving this provision in maths made at least good progress in 2014/15. The average points gain was 5.4.
After school clubs	Charge waived or subsidised activities for pupils in receipt of Pupil Premium.	All pupils wishing to attend were able to do so.
Subsidising the cost of school visits	All pupils will have access to school visits to enrich the curriculum and learning.	All children wishing to attend were able to go on school trips.
Inclusion Team	Subsidising the cost of a team consisting of the Inclusion support assistant, a PSA and a SENCo assigned to provide specific interventions to promote wellbeing, build resilience, and improve social interaction and mental health.	Support enabled pupils to better manage their behaviour and as a result this improved the learning conditions for all pupils.
School uniform	All children to wear the appropriate uniform and experience the sense of belonging and pride that it instils.	School uniform was given to all children who required it.
Tablets	All children in KS2 to have their own tablet to use as a learning tool to support learning.	All KS2 children were given their own tablet to be used in school.
